- No more conflicts between dongle drivers for SCIA Engineer and other software on your computer.

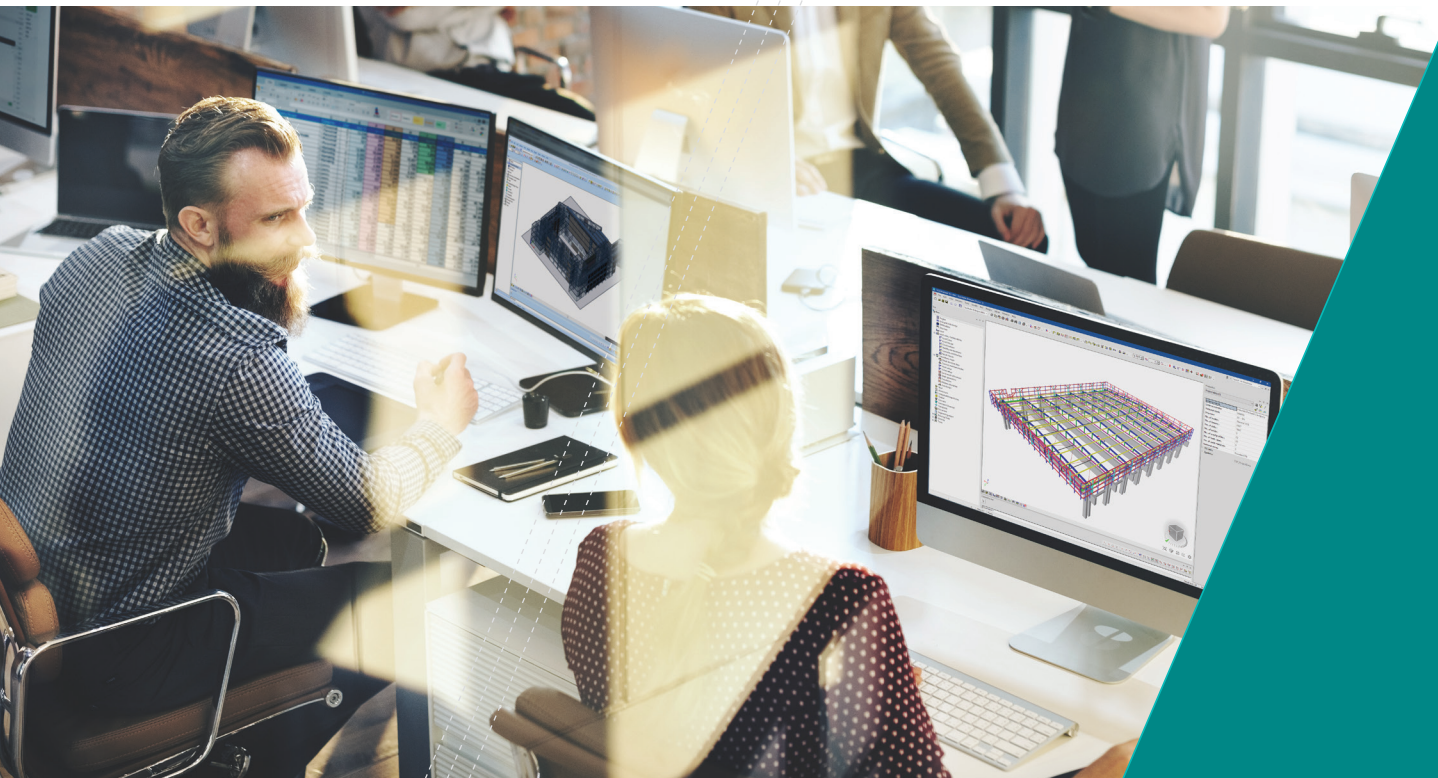


## Accessibility and mobility
